

NZIMRT Achievement Award

Nominations:

Any two NZIMRT members can nominate a person for the NZIMRT Achievement Award. A nomination shall be submitted in writing to the Board with a motivation for the nomination.

Nominations will be assessed by a subcommittee of the Board consisting of: President, Vice President and Education Director.

Criteria for Assessment:

The nominee must be a minimum of five years post-graduation.

The nominee must have been a member of the NZIMRT for a minimum of five years and must be a member at the time of nomination.

Commitment to profession as demonstrated through involvement and promotion of the professional body.

May be demonstrated by the following:

- ❖ Regular participant at local regional NZIMRT meetings
- ❖ Held a role within the NZIMRT at a local / national or international level
- ❖ Supported the organisation of local regional meetings; study days or conferences
- ❖ Had involvement in / or leadership of a modality group
- ❖ Presented at any professional meeting local, national or international
- ❖ Encourages workplace involvement and / or student membership of the NZIMRT
- ❖ Involvement with other professional bodies eg. MRTB, ISRR
- ❖ Involvement with professional publications eg. Peer reviewer

Commitment to clinical practice and advancement of patient care demonstrated by leadership within the clinical practice environs.

May be demonstrated by the following:

- ❖ Senior team member &/or team leader within the workplace
- ❖ Evidenced extended learning and practice
- ❖ A formal mentor / tutor / assessor for student practitioners
- ❖ Evidence of clinical leadership – eg. New techniques / practices / initiatives developed & demonstrated
- ❖ Presenter / teacher in the workplace
- ❖ Development of patient care initiatives
- ❖ Involvement with other professional groups in the workplace eg. Professional Advice Group
- ❖ Evidence of excellence within clinical practice or clinical education
- ❖ Team player
- ❖ Provides a quality, caring and professional service to patients / students and fellow staff members
- ❖ Roles of responsibility within the workplace are held beyond the daily workload

Commitment to the ongoing development of the medical imaging / therapy profession as demonstrated by involvement with education, continuing professional development and professional presentations – oral or written.

May be demonstrated by the following:

- ❖ Supports students in the workplace – formal / informal
- ❖ Member of an advisory group or radiology user group
- ❖ Demonstrates leadership within the workplace
- ❖ Evidence of own continuing professional development
- ❖ Published and / or presented locally, nationally, internationally
- ❖ Additional qualifications
